Monitor the sky

Watch for a dark or green-colored sky and large, dark, low-flying clouds.

Pull over, keep the engine running, put your head below the windows and cover your head with your hands and a blanket.



Do not seek shelter under a highway overpass.

Secure potential hazards

Move patio furniture indoors, or secure it. Inside, move objects away from windows.



Know where to go

Head to a storm cellar, basement or windowless room on the lowest floor of your house.

Devise a plan

Create an emergency plan, and practice it with your family. Also put together an emergency kit, and keep it handy.








Ms. Wheelchair Ohio 2024 - Gabby Kozinski






