

What is Early Intervention?

Early Intervention (EI) is a statewide system that provides coordinated services to parents of eligible children (ages birth to three) with developmental delays or disabilities. EI is grounded in the philosophy that young children learn best from familiar people in familiar settings.

Early Intervention builds upon and provides supports and resources to assist parents and caregivers to enhance children's learning and development through everyday routines. It is a collaborative, home and community-based system where you and a team work together to provide ongoing support to your child.

Every family served in EI will

have a local EI team that consists of a Help Me Grow service coordinator, Crawford County Board of Developmental Disabilities Early Intervention service providers, and your family. Evelyn Franklin and Shannon Lear are Crawford County's Early Intervention Developmental Specialists.

Early Intervention receives their referrals through Help Me Grow, who determines a child's eligibility for developmental services. Early Intervention Services are free and voluntary for families in Crawford County that have an infant or toddler who are determined to have delays in

one or more areas of development. The team provides strategies for families to implement at home to improve the child's specific area of delay.


What should I do if I suspect that my child has a significant developmental delay?


